Boarding Kennels

Which ones best for us and our canine friends.

Recently I booked my dogs into a boarding kennel for the weekend. I picked the kennel closest to our house (directly across the road) and didn't really pay a lot of attention to whether it was the best facility for me or my dogs. I was going to drop them off on Friday evening and collect them on the Sunday evening. I arrived 30 minutes prior to the deadline for dropping or picking up dogs so we wouldn't be rushed and I could have a good look around and ask them any questions. The lady, who seemed nice enough, took Bounce first. They looped a yellow lead around his neck and lead him away. The lady gave me another yellow lead for Visa and said she would come back to collect her. I followed after her as she lead Bounce behind the big security gates and asked if I could view the kennels that my dogs would be staying in. She replied that this was not possible as "No public was allowed access into the back kennels, although they were the same as the few that were out the front and I was welcome to check them out." She pointed to a sign, which clearly stated this. I froze – something didn't seem right. At this point Bounce was disappearing with the lady through the second set of security doors which were boarded up with tarpaulins so you could not see through them. In one hand I held the second yellow lead but at no point could my feet move any closer to my car to get the dog.

When the lady returned I asked her why I was not allowed to view the area. She said that it was because it upset the dogs and made it very clear that there was absolutely no way that I was going to be allowed to view the kennels. By this time I had imagined all sorts of reasons as to why I was not allowed to see the kennels, any of which could be true or there could in fact be nothing wrong with them. Either way I'll never know and to me it didn't matter anyway. My dogs were not staying in a facility that I could not view.
